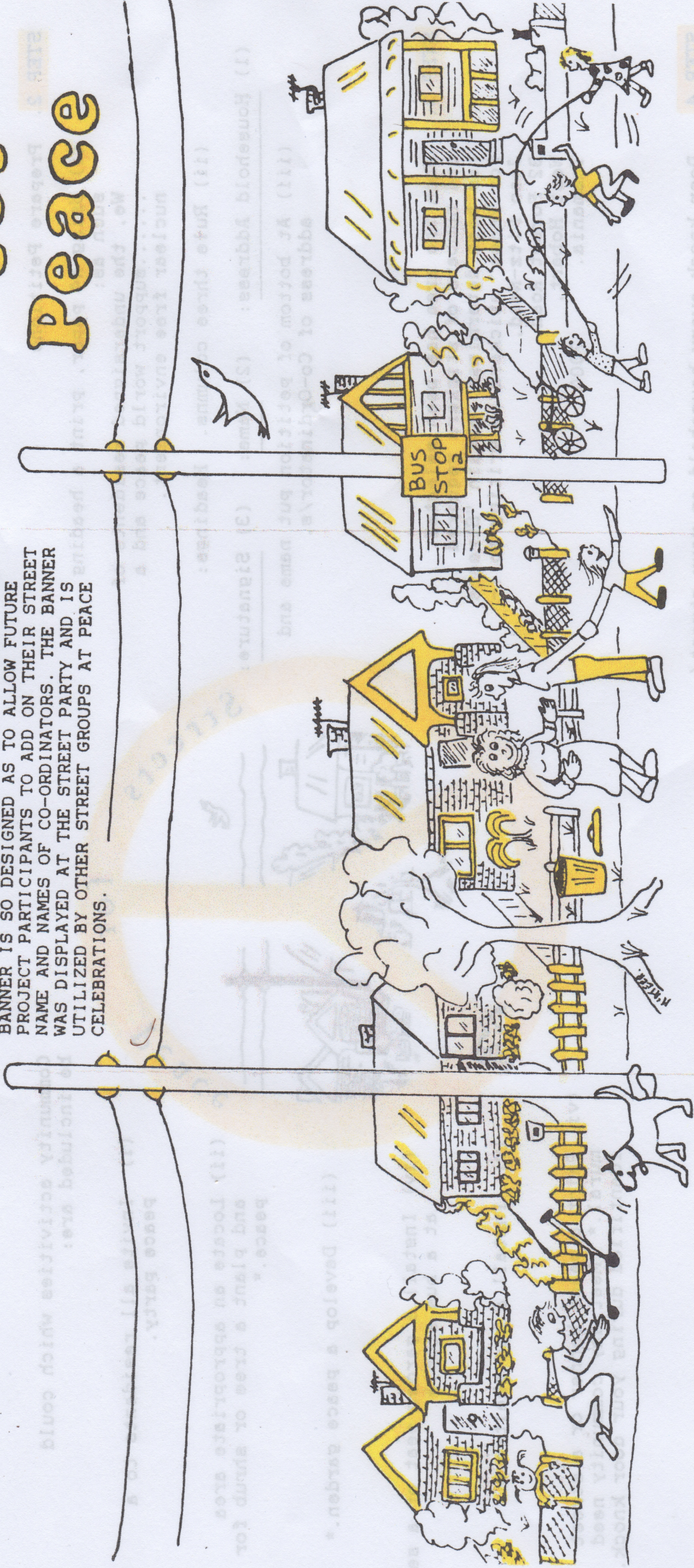


Create an Area for Peace.

IN THE INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF PEACE (1986) RESIDENTS OF FOREST ROAD, WEST HOBART, TASMANIA, CELEBRATED THEIR "STREET FOR PEACE" ACTIVITY WITH A PEACE PARTY, A PEACE GARDEN PLANTING AND THE INSTALLATION OF A GARDEN SEAT. SCHOOL CHILDREN IN FOREST ROAD WORKED WITH SIX WOMEN RESIDENTS AT THE LOCAL PRIMARY SCHOOL AFTER SCHOOL PAINTING A PEACE BANNER. THE BANNER IS SO DESIGNED AS TO ALLOW FUTURE PROJECT PARTICIPANTS TO ADD ON THEIR STREET NAME AND NAMES OF CO-ORDINATORS. THE BANNER WAS DISPLAYED AT THE STREET PARTY AND IS UTILIZED BY OTHER STREET GROUPS AT PEACE CELEBRATIONS.

5 EASY STEPS TO MAKE YOUR AREA A NUCLEAR FREE PEACE ZONE

STEP 1. One or more people become Co-Ordinators of Project.
Send completed petitions to Joan Fitz-Need. Retain a copy for your own file.

STEP 5.

STEP 2. Prepare Petitions

- (i) Using A4 paper, print a heading such as:
We, the undersigned residents ofsupport world peace and a nuclear free environment.

(ii) Rule three columns. Headings:

- (1) Household Address: (2) Name: (3) Signature:
- (iii) At bottom of petition put name and address of Co-Ordinator/s.

STEP 3.

When the area has been selected and numbers of stickers required has been determined, obtain "Streets for Peace" stickers by writing to :-

STEP 4.

Door knock every household on your street/road/crescent/area. Obtain signatures from as many householders as possible. Allow plenty of time for informed discussion. Distribute "Streets for Peace" sticker and request it be displayed in a prominent position.

Community activities which could be included are:

- (i) Invite all residents to a peace party.
- (ii) Locate an appropriate area and plant a tree or shrub for peace.*
- (iii) Develop a peace garden.*
- (iv) Install a garden seat or a seat at a bus stop.#
- (v) Install a bus shelter.#
- (vi) Paint a peace banner or a street mural.* Meet any community need identified during your door knock.

KEY: * Obtain Local Council permission.
Lobby Local Transport Department.
